## CORPUS CHRISTI, HASBROUCK HEIGHTS

### 5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Do you have enough? Many of us come from a nation of material abundance. We have all the things we could possibly need not only to survive, but to thrive - food, shelter, mental ability, income, access to medical care. Most people in human history lived with far less than we. So why are we so dissatisfied? Some Christians can be drawn to the "prosperity Gospel." This is the idea that following God will bring us material abundance in this life.

That surely seems to be the story of today's Gospel! Peter and his friends chose - with some faith - to put out their nets a final time at Jesus' command. "They caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking." What gift! What abundance! What prosperity! Peter and his friends caught more fish than they'd ever seen. Yet what is their response to this material abundance, this gift from God? They leave it behind. "When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him."

Praying for God to meet our physical, material needs is not a bad thing! Jesus himself includes "give us this day our daily bread" in the prayer he teaches his disciples. The question is, how do we respond when our prayers are answered? Do we thank God briefly, or perhaps ignore Him completely and move on with our lives? Or do we respond as Peter did? "God? You showed up in an area that has no bearing on my eternal salvation. You gave me a gift I didn't even really need. You love me! You really do love me." Is our gratitude only surface level? Or do we allow ourselves, like Peter did, to respond with wonder, awe, and deeper discipleship?

### A MESSAGE FROM FR. PAT....

If you were impressed by the fishing miracle in today's Gospel, just press your wrist or your neck. There you can feel your pulse. Your heart, another miracle, beats 50-100 times a minute! What a reminder that God performs this miracle again and again. As you sleep, God is awake, triggering your next heartbeat, keeping you alive as your heart pumps oxygenated blood throughout the body.

Peter and the other fisherman put their net out into deep water. They were blown away by the incredible catch that they abandoned their boats and immediately followed Jesus. Our own heartbeat and our fragile hold on life should inspire us to join the fisherman as well.

Today's readings attest to the fact that God's call list is littered with seemingly unworthy people. God's call has come—and still comes—in countless ways and in the midst of unabashedly simple work. The presence of the so-called "Hound of Heaven" is everywhere. Thinking "I am not worthy" didn't work for others, and it won't work for us. We may as well put our energy into watching and listening.

This weekend is designated "Scout Sunday". I welcome all our scouts, their leaders and family to Corpus Christi as they attend the 10am Mass this Sunday. Thank you for all you do for our Church and community.

Many are aware that Corpus Christi has an Adoration Chapel. The Adoration to the Blessed Sacrament takes place Monday through Friday from 11am to 11pm. Adorers are needed to fill in some hours. An hour of your time is needed! There are forms at the entrances of the Church and Chapel for you to complete and return to the Parish Center.

Ash Wednesday, March 6, marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. Often we reflect upon what can we give to the Lord during Lent. What a wonderful gift to give Him—to offer an hour of your time as an Adorer.
