A MESSAGE FROM FR. GABRIEL....

This week's Gospel tells of the parable of the King hosting a wedding banquet. The invited guests did not show which outraged the King. So much so that he sent messengers into the streets to round them up. The invited guests decline to attend again and kill the messengers sent by the King.

The King then sent his slaves into the streets to invite anyone they could find. The King went into the banquet to see the guests and observed one man not wearing the wedding robe provided. The guest did not give the King a reason for not wearing it. The King was offended and ejected the man from the banquet.

This parable is Jesus' comparison to heaven. We have to assume that the King in the parable is God. He is the king who issues an invitation to all at his discretion. There is a difference in someone who has a form of religion and someone who is a true believer.

There is really two basic responses to God's invitation to us; we either accept God's grace and humility and enter the kingdom of heaven or we reject both God and those that bring the invitation.

In the parable the King does not give up on finding people to attend his banquet. We cannot be so confident like the wedding guest who did not wear the wedding robe. The guest not obeying did him no good.

Jesus concludes the parable saying, "For many are called, but few are chosen." God's wants all His servants to go into the world to extend the invitation to everyone. The banquet table is set, and God is waiting for you with open arms.

God is gracious, and God is just. The good news is that God's grace is offered to all. We do a disservice to God and His grace if we believe there are not consequences for rejecting that same grace.

My dear friends, it is wonderful to have so many of you back in Church. Our attendance numbers keep climbing. Welcome back to sharing as a community at the table of the Lord. Just remember to email or call to reserve your seats.

Fall is in the air, and our parish is getting ready to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation with 82 of our young adults. Confirmation will take place on October 17 and 24. Keep our candidates in your prayers as they become fully-initiated in our faith.

OPENING OF THE 2021 MASS BOOK

Due to the current circumstances of social distancing, the opening of the Mass Book will have new rules to follow. Your patience and understanding is needed to have proper procedures in place.

The Mass Book will open over a two-day period with shortened hours. **This will take place on Tuesday, October 27 and Wednesday, October 28, from 9-11am & 1-3pm.**

Please note:

1. **DO NOT GATHER IN A GROUP ON THE PORCH OF THE PARISH CENTER.** Social Distancing must be maintained. No one will be distributing numbered papers until 8:45am. Everyone must be understanding with the opening this year.
2. You will be handed a numbered sheet and provide your name and cell phone number upon arrival. **Depending on the weather, you will be asked to return to your car to fill in the information or there will be a few socially distanced chairs set up in the indoor porch.**
3. You will be called (either in person or via cell phone) when it is your turn to enter the Parish Center.
4. Your temperature will be taken before entering. No more than one person will be allowed to enter at a time. **FACE COVERING MUST BE WORN.** This is our normal business procedure.
5. **During the first two-days of the book opening, you will only be allowed to schedule a maximum of 6 Masses (3 weekday/3 weekend). This is our regular practice—NO EXCEPTIONS. You cannot come both days.**
6. **BRING YOUR OWN PEN.** We do not want to share pens. If we have to provide a pen to you, please do not leave it—take it with you.
7. We cannot accept large bills for change. Checks are payable to Corpus Christi. If you are purchasing candles/hosts/wine, a separate check is required.
8. Mass times remain the same: 5pm (Saturday) 8am, 10am, 12nn & 6pm (suspended for summer). Weekday Masses are 6:30am (suspended from Memorial Day to Labor Day) and 8am. Some dates/times may not be available. Masses are \$10/each.
9. Candle offering is \$10/week, Wine is \$20/week and Hosts are \$25/week.
10. We cannot accommodate email/phone requests during the opening.

Please adhere to the guidelines above. They are put in place for your safety as well as ours.
